# PREPARING FOR HIGH SCHOOL GRADE 9 PATHWAY

### What is De-streaming?

- De-streaming means that students will no longer be separated into Academic and Applied streams. Students will take a combination of courses made up of De-streamed, Inclusive Academic and Open level courses. Locally developed courses will still be available for some students as well.
- In De-streamed and Inclusive Academic classrooms, there will be a distinct shift in pedagogical practices and assessment to ensure improved equitable outcomes for all students.
- De-streamed, Inclusive Academic and Open courses will prepare students for university, college, apprenticeship and workplace pathways, providing more post-secondary options for our students.



# PREPARING FOR HIGH SCHOOL GRADE 9 PATHWAY

What is the difference between Inclusive Academic, Inclusive De-streamed and Inclusive Open Grade 9 Courses?

- Inclusive Grade 9 Academic uses the Academic curriculum expectations
- Inclusive Grade 9 De-streamed uses the new De-streamed curriculum expectations
- Inclusive Grade 9 Open uses the Open curriculum and allows students to keep their options open regarding post-secondary opportunities

• All of the courses are grounded in Universal Design for Learning, including a focus on Culturally Responsive and Relevant Pedagogy, Differentiated Instruction, Assessment and Evaluation and classroom supports for all students



PREPARING FOR HIGH SCHOOL GRADE 9 PATHWAY AT AJAX HS

- Science, English, Geography and Math are taught at the Destreamed pathway
- French is taught at the Inclusive Academic pathway and Open pathway
- Successful completion of the Gr. 9 De-streamed/Inclusive
   Academic courses allows you to take "Applied" and/or
   "Academic" courses in grade 10.





## PREPARING FOR HIGH SCHOOL GRADE 9 PATHWAY

At Ajax HS, English, Math and Science are also offered at the Locally Developed (L) pathway.

- For students who require additional support and flexibility
- Reinforces elementary curriculum while providing skills necessary for further study

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- Students are traditionally identified and reviewed into these courses in their IPRC meetings
- All subjects DO NOT have to be taken at the same level

OSSD REQUIREMENTS ONLINE LEARNING GRADUATION REQUIREMENT



As per the Ministry of Education, all students must earn a minimum of two online learning credits as part of the requirement for the Ontario Secondary School Diploma. The elearning courses are available in grades 11 and 12.

HOWEVER, there is a process for families to OPT-OUT of this graduation requirement.

### Online Learning Graduation Requirement Opt-Out Form

### About the online learning graduation requirement

Students are required to earn two online learning credits to graduate from secondary school, beginning with every student who entered Grade 9 in the 2020-21 school year

The ministry recognizes the extraordinary circumstances of the COVID-19 pandemic. (As a result, up to one secondary school credit completed by Grade 9 students in the 2020-2021 school year during the province-wide school closures (from April 2021 to June 2021) will be counted towards the graduation requirement).

Adult learners entering the Ontario secondary school system in 2023-24 or later will be required to meet this graduation requirement and may opt themselves out of the requirement. The graduation requirement is intended to support students in developing familiarity and comfort with working and learning in a fully online environment, as well as developing digital literacy and other important transferable skills that will help prepare them for success after graduation and in all aspects of their lives.

Meeting the online learning graduation requirement should not pose a barrier to graduation for students. As with all learning, students taking online courses will have access to the supports they need through their school, (e.g., guidance, riextra-curricular activities and services for English-language learners). If publicly funded school has an Individual Education Plan, the plan should be shared, when appropriate, with an educator instructing an online course delivered by another publicly funded school board, with the necessary consent.

Parents/guardians may choose to opt their child out of the mandatory online courses required for graduation. Students age 18 years of age or older or students who are 16 or 17 years of age and have withdrawn from parental control can also opt out of the graduation requirement. School boards must also allow for students and parents/guardinas to opt back into the online learning graduation requirement should their decision change.

### **Continuing Education**

Durham Continuing Education (DCE) provides credit and non-credit programming for students age 4 to adult. Students can earn new credits, upgrade previously taken credits, strengthen language skills or learn a new language. DCE provides various methods of delivery to help students find the program and schedule that works for them. Come Live, Learn and Achieve with Durham Continuing Education.











### **GETTING READY FOR HIGH SCHOOL:**

- This program is open to all students entering grade 9 in the Fall 2024 and provides student with a brief introduction to the grade 9 English and Mathematics curriculum, as well as study skills, time management, and steps to success.
- The program also allows students to become familiar with their new school and prepares them for the transition from elementary to secondary school.
- It is especially helpful for students who are experiencing some anxiety related to the upcoming transition. This program will be delivered by qualified teachers and where possible, teachers from the school in which the program is held.
- It is recommended that students attend the program at the secondary school they will be attending in Fall 2024 as the programs will be tailored to that school.
